De-institutionalization of Shriram Children's Home- Families were united with their children from the Home. These children will be supported by the institution through sponsorships. Other thakn this nearly 7 single parents moved to stay with their kids in Thiruneermalai locality .They were advised that children can stay with them and continue to get support for education and for other requirements which they cannot meet out due to lack of resources. Highlights

Shriram Vocational training Centre took up a job of stitching uniforms

for 600 students of Shriram Matriculation school, Thiruneermalai. Nearly 8 ladies who are trained tailors were provided initial training by experts to handle this. The team took two months to complete this task. The unit is also planning to establish a Self Help Group. This will be a gateway for more ladies to work and market their products.



Shriram-IGNOU Community College students finished their Associate degree programme in "Sports Education" and started working in Shriram Matriculation School, Thiruneermalai as teachers.

In **Sri Sri Vidya Mandir (SSVM)**, Anakoil, Students and Teachers cocreated a Tamil Newsletter on 29th June, 2012. The purpose of the newsletter is to report events happening in the school and around the communities students come from.

10th results: All 21 students who had appeared for the 10th standard examination passed with flying colours. 10 students out of 21 scored over 80%.

In VSR, Reddivaripalli, students took responsibility of cleaning and maintaining the school. Students took the responsibility of cleaning the whole ground and now they maintain the cleanliness and hygiene by cleaning it every day whenever they get time or see something lying on the ground.
